

### Beschreibung

Reproductive hormone levels in cooperatively breeding desert birds, such as Harris's Hawk *Parabuteo unicinctus*, are high in the alpha male and in unrelated male helpers, but are low in related male helpers. Unrelated helpers are reproductively competent and may occasionally copulate with the alpha.
